Participants will learn how to draw the human brain, build it out of clay, AND they can take it home. We will finish our time together by dissecting a preserved sheep brain.

Age recommendation: 7-12 grade, limit 65 participants, cost based on specimens

Science of the Human Body: All About the Heart

God has placed the parts in the body, every one of them, just as he wanted them to be (1 Corinthians 12:18). God's design for the human body is wonderful and amazing. Come see how the Creator sculpted the four-chamber heart and amazing vessels during this hands-on workshop. Participants will start by drawing and building the heart out of clay. This finished masterpiece can be taken home with them. Participants will then finish by dissecting a preserved sheep heart.

Age recommendation: 7-12 grade, limit 65 participants, cost based on specimens

Other anatomy content areas that can be taught include (well.... really all of them, but here are few to pick from):

- Skeletal System, Muscular System, Digestive & Urinary Systems
 - These would include an anatomy lesson, drawing & clay modeling
 - Urinary system could include a kidney dissection
